BUFFING DEMO



Ed Sandle gave us a great demo on buffing.

Ed demoed the type of buffing system he uses and how he decided on this one. He explained how the Beall System that fits on a shaft on your lathe doesn't give you enough room to buff large pieces. The buffing wheels are too close together and one wheel get in the way of the other with large pieces. He then showed 2 12" extensions that screw onto your head stock shaft. He said you can order them from Don Pencil. <http://www.donpencil.com/WNTADAPTORS.htm> If you go th

this link you will find the 12" extension is \$24.50.

Ed then demoed with an attachment that fit the shaft of a 1750 rpm motor. He used the buffing wheels to show various effects on different wood. He said that he doesn't use the white diamond on dark wood like Black Walnut. Also with some of his finishes he starts with white diamond. He said he likes to use poly for a finish.
